PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR WINTER

Given the end of summer and an enjoyable fall season, it is difficult to think of preparing your home for winter.

But with severe winter predictions, it would be wise to start thinking about steps you might take to prepare for snow and wintery weather.

Prudent home owners should do some planning on steps to take for reducing heat loss and for protecting property. Here are some useful suggestions:

- 1. Check for drafts around windows and doors.
- 2. Caulk inside and outside and install weather strips where indicated.
- 3. Inspect wooden window frames for rot and decay. If they are compromised, install an insulation kit, plastic sheeting affixed to interior wood with double faced tape, as a temporary measure to prevent warm air from escaping.
- 4. Replace screen doors with storm doors.
- 5. Remove or cover window air conditioners.
- 6. Inspect your roof for damaged or warped shingles. Check for deteriorated flashing at the chimney, wall and skylights.
- 7. Clean gutters and down spouts so water and ice can properly drain. Make sure that snow and rain drain away from the foundation so that water will not enter your basement.
- 8. Your furnace should be cleaned and serviced annually. Clean or replace furnace filters as well as your humidifier.
- 9. Check attic insulation. If you can see ceiling joists, you don't have sufficient insulation. If you are adding insulation, use the type which has a "Kraft-face finish" with a paper backing which acts as a vapor barrier to prevent moisture issues.
- 10. Water lines running through an unheated basement and outside faucets and sprinkler heads should be wrapped.
- 11. Ensure that all outside vents and openings are covered to prevent birds and rodents from entering.

WOOD BURNING FIREPLACES WASTE HEAT by Sidney Elkin

On a chilly night, a gas log fireplace radiates heat into a room providing a cozy warm feeling. For those who use a wood burning fireplace, if possible, consider installing a gas logs firebox or an electric fireplace since they more efficiently deliver warm air into your room

Wood burning fireplaces tend to lose more energy than they produce because they pull heat out of a room sending it up the chimney. The same may be true of wood burning stoves which give off an abundance of smoke, soot and pollution into the atmosphere.

A gas log vent-free system requires no chimney, flue or outside exhaust. If you don't have a fire-place, and if you want additional heat, investigate an inexpensive gas log system, in order to re-

duce heating costs. These fireplaces can use natural or propane gas.



If you do use a wood burning fireplace or a wood stove, have your chimney and flue inspected. Chimney cleaning or repair may be appropriate. Check to see if your smoke detector is operational. Have your smoke detector and battery-operated carbon monoxide detector located near your fireplace or wood burning stove. These are a few safety measures to take before the onset of winter.

PREPARING YOUR VEHICLE FOR WINTER

We all know about making our homes more efficient in the colder winter months but too many forget about their car. I will admit, I am guilty of this too.

Here are a few things you can do to be sure your vehicle will be ready for traveling in the winter weather.



- * Have your battery checked.
- * Check all your fluids oils, brake, transmission, radiator, windshield wiper.
- * Check your tires
 - Is the tread good?

Just take a penny, hold it vertically with Lincoln facing you and place the dated section of the coin into several tread grooves across the tire. If part of our 16th President's head is always hidden by the tread, you have more than 2/32" of tread depth remaining

- Do they need air?

The inside of your driver's side door will have the amount of air needed for each tire.

- Is your spare in good condition?

Whether you have a donut or a full size spare, check the tread and air to be sure it is ready to be used if needed.

* Put an emergency kit in your vehicle

Blanket – Just on case you need to wait for a pickup in the cold.

Flash light – for checking on a problem in the dark.

Flares – to light to alert other motorists of your stopped vehicle.


Cell phone charger – to be sure you have a charged cell phone to call for help


First aid kit – for any minor injuries that may happen
